

## TIPS FOR USE

The following tips are based on our experience, or from feedback we've received from our customers. We appreciate all feedback, so please feel free to provide it. If you run across something while using The Magician Curry Wash, please check the TIPS FOR USE page. 1. A circular motion with the curry head, not only helps loosen dirt, dry skin and loose hair, it also helps relax your pet.
2. Although you can use most shampoos with the curry wash, the thicker the shampoo, the longer it lasts.
3. For dogs and horses that are afraid of jets of water (aka hoses) you may want to start out with the curry head against their body before turning the water on, using the on off valve of the curry near the hose connection.
4. Store the curry wash in the rinse position
5. Once you have filled the curry wash with shampoo, do not turn the center dial to suds until you are ready to turn on the water. This prevents shampoo from seeping into the water canal and causing an excess of shampoo in one area.
6. You should be able to stay dry while washing your dog or horse. This will not be possible if you kneel, sit, lie in the water that hits the ground. Also, if you turn the curry towards you, you will get wet.
7. Initially, the turning of the center dial may be difficult. It will become easier with use. You may want to turn it from suds to rinse and back several times, if necessary, before use.
8. Washing long necked horses may cause water to run down your arm.
9. You should be able to wash 2 very large dogs (St. Bernards), or one average size horse with one filling of the reservoir (Harley is 17 hands and can be washed normally with one filling). If you spend a great deal of time in one spot, or have a very dirty horse it may take more (Harley rolls in mud puddles and gets coated, it then takes 1 and a half fills).
10. Excess shampoo may get in the threads of the curry head if there is spill over between the cover of the reservoir and the curry heads. It may then solidify and make it more difficult to screw the curry heads on and off. Either rinse or wipe off any excess shampoo in this area to prevent this.
